RESOLUTION NO. 02-10-190

REQUESTING THE POSTAL INSPECTOR, PROVINCIAL POST OFFICE, CALAPAN CITY, TO CONDUCT IMMEDIATE INVESTIGATION AND TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION PERTAINING TO THE LOSS OF FIFTEEN (15) REGISTERED MAILES LAST AUGUST 30, 2002 AT BULALACAO MUNICIPAL POST OFFICE, MUNICIPALITY OF BULALACAO, PROVINCE OF ORIENTAL MINDORO

"WHEREAS, communication is one of the most important tools for development of our modern society with which an effective and efficient postal system is of vital necessity;

"WHEREAS, in this electronic generation like ours, wherein fax machine, cellphones, internet are the common trends of the time, nevertheless, it is still through the traditional sending of letters that the greatest bulk of our great majority relies on due to its accessibility to the public, affordability and reliability;

"WHEREAS, this duty is carried on by our present Philippine Postal Corporation working on the principles of reliability, secrecy and confidentiality between the Postal Corporation and its clientelles;

"WHEREAS, this august Body is afraid that these sacred principles were somehow broken with the unexplained loss of at least fifteen (15) registered mails inside the post office of this Municipality, just recently;

"WHEREAS, such loss of those registered mails could not be possibly happened in transit for those who already logged in the Postal Office Registry Book, and according to the investigation, letters address for Bulalacao was picked-up from Roxas by Bulalacao post office personnel, on August 20, 2002

only after ten (10) days, August 30, 2002 that they allegedly found out that at least fifteen (15) registered mails were missing and our curiosity was aroused upon learning that such incidence was reported to the attention of the Philippine National Police (PNP) on September 4, 2002 only, hence we became alarmed of this abnormal development;
