"WHEREAS, Article II in Section 12 of the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines, provides for the protection and strenghtening of the family as a basic autonomous social institution thus, the State shall aid and support the natural right and duty of parents in rearing the youth for civic efficiency and the development of moral character;

"WHEREAS, Article 1 of P.D. 603 recognizes the child as one of the most important assets of the nation, so that every effort should be exerted to promote his welfare and enhance his opportunities for a useful and happy life;

"WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 6972 otherwise known as the "Barangay-Level Total Development and Protection of Children Act" provides for the establishment of a day care center in every barangay and to carry out a program for the total development and protection of children;

"WHEREAS, it is imperative that day care centers be established to every barangay in order to provide Day Care Service which shall give supplemental parental care to a 0 to 6 year old child who may be neglected, potentially neglected, abused, exploited or abandoned during part of the day when the parents cannot attend to his need;

"WHEREAS, above noble objectives are seemed to be difficult for the local government to realized, due to its very limited financial resource (Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro is one of the 150 Low Income Municipalities under Proclamation No. 390;

"WHEREAS, we firmly believe that the good senator, being a true servant of the people, will be ready to lend us the proverbial helping hand;

WHEREFORE, upon motion, duly seconded, be it:

RESOLVED TO REQUEST, as it hereby requests, Hon. Ernesto F. Herrera, Senate of the Republic of the Philippines, Manila to please assist the Municipality of Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro in the construction of Day Care Center in Barangay Maasin;
