**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PREVENTION, CONTROL AND
REDUCTION OF DENGUE CASES, IMPOSING PENALTIES THEREOF
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Bulalacao and its component barangays as local government units are mandated under the local Government Code to promote health and safety of its constituents by providing measures to prevent and control the spread of diseases, particularly Dengue, and provide assistance to those afflicted;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Health Office has reported a significant number of dengue cases last 2021 and remain to be present in the succeeding years, thereby making dengue fever as one of the health problems in the municipality especially during rainy seasons;

WHEREAS, the Local Government of Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro sees it imperative to address Dengue to avoid outbreaks from happening, and saving the lives of its constituents in doing so;

WHEREAS, given the preventability of the disease, it is prudent to provide programs and activities which are community-based implemented by the LGU Bulalacao;

WHEREAS, in the country, dengue remains to be endemic and number of cases is expected to increase during the rainy season;

WHEREAS, environmental sanitation is still the most effective way in the elimination and ultimate destruction of breeding sites of the mosquito vector carrying the disease;



WHEREAS, environmental sanitation as a preventive measure can be achieved and sustained through community and stakeholder's participation at multilevel of community;

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be otherwise known as "**Anti-Dengue Ordinance of Municipality of Bulalacao**".



SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this Ordinance the following terms are hereby defined as follows:



- a.) Dengue – an acute infectious disease by a flavivirus (species Dengue virus of the genus Flavivirus), transmitted by "aedes" mosquitoes, and characterized by headache, severe joint pain, and a rash. It is also called break bone fever, dengue fever;
- b.) Stagnant Water – Motionless water, not flowing in a stream or current; also known as standing water;
- c.) Public Places/ Establishments – hotels, motels, dormitories, commercial buildings, lodging and boarding houses, apartments hospitals, libraries, museums, offices, malls, markets, supermarkets, movie houses, schools, colleges and universities and other similar institutions;
- d.) Vector – an organism that can carry a particular disease; causative agent like a Virus;
- e.) Aedes aegypti – a genus of mosquitoes found in tropical and subtropical zones, but now found on all continents except Antarctica;
- f.) Public Places – park, Plazas, picnic grounds, camps, roads, cemeteries and memorial parks, terminals, rest areas, and other open fields and enclosed areas of public assembly;



g.) Integrated Control – controlling pest through to the use of several different methods and procedures which are used to complement each other. These procedures may include the use of pesticides, environment sanitation measures, natural as well as mechanical and biological control methods;

h.) Person-in-charge – those in charge of households or establishments;

i.) Place – land, building, residence, pier, watercraft, or any means of conveyance;

j.) Premises – a house or building, together with its land and out buildings, occupied by a business or house;

k.) Perimeter – from Latin, meaning “around” (peri) and “measure boundary of houses, buildings or any establishments;

l.) Water containers – any open receptacles such as discarded tin cans, buckets, pails or any large plastic containers/ “balde”, empty pots or empty bottles;

m.) Water containing objects – any object that collects/accumulate water such as plastic or metal bottle caps, tires, pitcher plants and the like;

n.) Pesticides – any substance or product, or mixture intended to control, prevent, destroy, repel or mitigate, directly or indirectly any pest;

o.) Fumigation – the act of applying, releasing or dispensing a toxic chemical so that it reaches the target organism primarily or wholly in gaseous state;

p.) Misting – a fine spray of approved chemicals to control or eradicate the vector of the disease;

q.) Pest Control Operator – refers to establishment or entity engaged in the application of pesticides or any other methods or services for urban pest control or implementation of a vermin reduction and mitigation program;

r.) Aksiyon Barangay Kontra Dengue (ABKD) – nationwide campaign for massive clean- up drives starting from the barangay level to mobilize all sectors concerned in reducing dengue morbidity and mortality;



s.) Dengue Fast Lane – established system in prioritizing dengue patients in the health facilities by administering efficient and prompt case management during dengue season;

t.) Ovi-Larval Traps – use to validate the absence of mosquitoes and the reduction of mosquito population.

SECTION 3. PROHIBITED ACTS. The following acts are declared prohibited by this ordinance:



- a. Stockpiling of water in open water containers for more than seven days within the premises and perimeter of houses and establishments;
- b. Leaving empty open water containers or water containing objects within the perimeter of houses and establishments;
- c. Leaving of uncleaned or unmaintained open containers or water containing objects filled with water in the premises of houses and establishments; and
- d. Maintaining undrained bodies of water within the perimeter of houses and establishments.



SECTION 4. VECTOR BREEDING GROUNDS CONTROL. Building/ structures under construction must not accumulate stagnant water and solid waste. All owners, managers, administrators and/ or care takers of households, schools, vacant lots, abandoned houses, tire trading/ merchandiser business, and all other buildings/ establishment within the municipality are mandated to get rid of vectors' breeding ground, particularly stagnant water, to avoid mosquito larvae (kiti-kiti), otherwise, they are presumed to have violated this ordinance.

SECTION 6 - FUNCTION AND RESPONSIBILITIES. Consistent with the rules and guidelines by the Department of Health regarding the prevention and control of dengue, the Municipal Anti-Dengue Committee shall have the following functions:

a.) Direct all heads of schools and Punong Barangays to practice daily the 4 o'clock habit where every 4 o'clock in the afternoon, all communities and schools shall search for all water-holding containers that maybe a breeding sites for mosquitoes, putting cover/lid to water containers and / or the application of biological/ chemical larvicides and members of the community both in public and private sector shall conduct measures to prevent water stagnation at all times;

b.) Direct all heads of schools and Punong Barangays the implementation of the Enhanced 4S Strategy towards sustained reduction of mosquito population and decrease dengue cases. Enhances 4S strategy stands for:

- i. Search and destroy breeding sites;
- ii. Seek Early consultation; ensure Dengue Fast Lane is established to reduce dengue morbidity and mortality;
- iii. Self-protection (wearing of long sleeves, light-colored clothing, long pants and socks during daytime, application of insect repellants, use of screen door and windows; and
- iv. Say yes to fogging only during outbreaks in hot spot areas where increase in cases is registered for two consecutive weeks.

c.) Mobilize the resources of the LGU and render assistance when necessary in the conduct of cleanliness drives/ activities such as dismantling of all possible breeding places of mosquitoes, dredging of clogged canals and communicating relevant information against Dengue, awareness campaign and measures to prevent it;

d.) Direct the Punong Barangays to implement the Aksyon Barangay Kontra Dengue (ABKD) in their respective communities and schools as preventive measures of the spread of dengue fever in the municipality;

e.) The Municipal Health Office shall establish a team for vector surveillance, risk assessment and response. The team shall be guided in the selection of appropriate vector control intervention to be implemented in a particular barangay.

f.) Engage the participation of all households, and the public and private sector in the drive to abate the number of dengue cases in the municipality through massive information dissemination and search and destroy operations;

g.) Assign one (1) specific day for a month for the simultaneous holding of Clean-up Drive in the fifteen (15) barangays;

h.) Tap the support of the socio-civic and business sector to generate resources e.g volunteers, drugs/medical/ laboratory supplies, IEC materials, reporting forms, et cetera;

- i.) Reproduce information education campaign (IEC) materials, reporting forms and distribute these to barangays and school communities;
 - j.) Provide technical and logistics support to the fifteen (15) Barangay Anti- Dengue Task Forces;
 - k.) Establish and institutionalize an effective recording and reporting system for vector control and surveillance information by establishing a Municipal Epidemiological Surveillance Unit (MESU) through the Municipal Health Office and analyze and submit the report to the Provincial Health Office;
 - l.) Coordinate with other government and private medical institutions relative to the surveillance system and management for suspected dengue cases and with DOH for needed technical assistance in the implementation of Enhanced 4S-strategy;
 - m.) Attend regular Task Force meeting;
 - n.) Establish Dengue Fast Lane in the Municipal Health Office and Bulalacao Community Hospital, and
 - o.) Perform other function as it may deem necessary in the control prevention and elimination of dengue in the Municipality;

SECTION 7. BARANGAY ANTI-DENGUE TASK FORCE. Every Barangay in the Municipality of Bulalacao shall create its Barangay Anti-Dengue Task Force. The Task Force shall be composed of the following:

- Members - Sang. Barangay Chairman, Committee on Health Rural Health Midwife
- DOH – deployed Human Resources for Health
- Barangay Health Workers
- Head, DepEd Barangay
- SK President
- Barangay Sanitary Officer

The Task Force is created to aid in the implementation, enforcement and monitoring of this ordinance as well as conduct information campaign against Dengue, conduct community awareness campaign that will inform the constituents. They must also ensure that all households, municipal-wide shall search and destroy all possible breeding sites of mosquitoes.

SECTION 8. FUNCTIONS OF THE BARANGAY ANTI-DENGUE COMMITTEE. The Barangay Anti-Dengue Committee shall have the following function:

- 1.) Ensure that every household, establishment, offices (private or public), religious institutions, DEPED within its jurisdiction shall:

- a. Dispose, empty, seal, store discarded tires, bottles, broken appliances, garbage, paint cans, etc.
 - b. Regularly clean containers or replace water in containers that are usually filled with water by people, such as drums, aquariums, ponds, fountains, animal feeding bowls and pools;
 - c. Keep its respective surroundings and areas of responsibility clean;
 - d. Implement other preventive actions that the Department of Health (DOH) may provide like the 4 O'clock habit, 4S Strategy kontra Dengue and Aksyon Barangay Kontra Dengue;
 - e. Ensure the conduct of information and education on Dengue prevention and control to all school children and their parents/guardians.
- 2.) Establish and functionalize Barangay Dengue Brigade and Purok Dengue Brigade for each purok to monitor and ensure that the ordinance is properly and strictly implemented within their respective jurisdiction;
 - 3.) Make Aksiyon Barangay Kontra Dengue, including the implementation of this ordinance, a part of the barangay health program and appropriating fund to it;
 - 4.) Conduct inspection activities as provided by this ordinance;
 - 5.) Coordinate with the Municipal Health Office in the conduct of misting/fogging operations, search and destroy activities and related activities;
 - 6.) Conduct massive information and education drive in its respective jurisdiction on prevention, control of dengue;
 - 7.) Tap the support of the socio-civic, business sector to generate resources e.g. volunteers, drugs/medical/laboratory supplies, IEC materials, reporting forms, etc.;
 - 8.) Assign one (1) specific day of every week for the simultaneous holding of the Clean-up Drives and de-clogging of canals;
 - 9.) Intensify the conduct of monthly Clean-Up Drive in the barangay;
 - 10.) Conduct Task Force meeting and Render report base on their performance on Dengue control and prevention to the Municipal Mayor and/or DILG on a quarterly basis;
 - 11.) Promote awareness of this ordinance to their constituents;
 - 12.) Coordinate with the Municipal Health Office on recording and reporting system for vector control surveillance information;
 - 13.) Deputize enforcers (BHWs, BNS, DCWs, and Purok officers) and enforce the provisions of this ordinance; and

14.) Perform other activities incidental and necessary in the control, prevention and elimination of dengue in their respective barangay.

SECTION 8. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PERSON-IN-CHARGE. Person-in-charge or household owners and establishments shall:

a.) Search and destroy breeding sites

- Water drums, pails and similar containers must be covered at all times;
- Old, discarded tires should be punctured or cut or donate to LGU for other purposes;
- Unused tin cans, jars, bottles, pots and the like should be properly collected, stored;
- Gutters of roof must be maintained free from accumulation of rain water;
- Abandoned swimming pools, or fountains must be treated with larvicides or other means of controlling the vector;
- Uninhabited structures/buildings must be free from all kinds of waste and stagnant waters;
- All plant vases and pots, open bamboo poles, free holes, leaf plant axils, other natural or artificial containers that may accumulate water, shall always be checked as the potential breeding place of "aedes aegypti" mosquitoes;
- Junk shops shall secure their junk yard with proper roofing facility.

SECTION 9 – CREATION OF ANTI-DENGUE TASK FORCE AND DEPUTATION OF ENFORCERS AND THEIR FUNCTIONS.

COMPOSITION:

1. Municipal Health Officer
2. Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Officer
3. Pangulo, Liga ng mga Barangay
4. Sanitary Inspection Officer
5. BNS, BHW, DepEd Personnel, Barangay Tanods, NGO's Religious Sectors and

An Anti- Dengue Task Force shall be created and organized which shall formulate comprehensive policies, programs and guidelines on the prevention and control of the dengue. Likewise, it shall monitor the implementation of the clean-up drive; coordinate with agencies or offices concerned relative to the information and awareness campaign against dengue; and created Dengue Monitoring and Prevention team which shall be primarily responsible for the monitoring of the incidence of dengue in fifteen (15) barangay of the municipality and submission of monthly report anent data collected on dengue cases in the barangays to the Anti- Dengue Task Force and Municipal Health Office.

An Orientation shall be conducted by the Municipal Health Office and the Office of the Municipal Mayor for the enforcers of this ordinance and their names shall later be endorsed by the Health Officer to the Mayor for deputation.

SECTION 9. ENFORCEMENT ON HOUSES AND ESTABLISHMENTS. Ninety (90) days after the effectivity of this ordinance, inspection teams composed of Dengue Task Force, whether municipal or barangay, shall conduct inspection of houses and establishments to determine compliance with the provision of this ordinance. Regular inspection shall be conducted at least twice a year. The inspection team shall issue a citation ticket against violators upon finding of non-compliance with or any violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 10. CONDUCT OF ORIENTATION AND SEMINARS. Within ninety (60) days from the effectivity of this ordinance, the MHO, MESU and RSI shall develop and conduct a series of orientation, seminar for the enforcers of this ordinance and at least one for each Task Force.

SECTION 11 – PREVENTION AND CONTROL.

- a. All other interventions especially the use of chemicals other than for research purposes shall secure clearance from the Municipal Health Office (MHO) prior to its conduct.
- b. Pest Control Operators shall be accredited by the MHO prior to the render of services within the jurisdiction of Bulalacao.
- c. The DepEd shall continue to observe the '4 o'clock habit' in cleaning the sorroundings or school premises.

SECTION 12. FOCAL SPRAY. - Focal spray shall only be used to control Dengue during epidemic or outbreak.

SECTION 13. COMMUNITY INFORMATION EDUCATION CAMPAIGN (IEC) AND PUBLIC AWARENESS. The Municipal Health Office shall, in cooperation of the with the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO), Public Information Officer, Liga ng mga Barangay (LnB), SK and the Barangay concerned shall conduct a massive public awareness campaign which include but not limited to, health education including the organization/coordination and lectures, Ovi-larvitrapping, manner of destroying breeding sites, and participation in the "Oplan Linis" Activities as well as disseminate all information relative to the implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 14 – SURVEILLANCE - The Municipal Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit of the Municipal Health Office shall monitor Dengue cases and provide data to the Barangay Government Units, Municipal Mayor, Sangguniang Bayan, Provincial Health Office and DOH Regional Office.

SECTION 15 – RULES AND REGULATION. The Municipal Health Office shall, in coordination with the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) and Liga ng mga Barangay (LnB) shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to prevent, control and abate the mosquito vector of dengue, subject to the approval of the local Chief Executive. Such rule and regulations shall take effect upon approval.

SECTION 16. PENALTIES. All owners, managers, administrators who fails or refuse to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished in accordance with the following penalties:

- 1st Offense – written warning to be issued by the Municipal Health Office;
- 2nd Offense – A fine of one thousand pesos (PhP1,000.00);
- 3rd Offense – A fine of two thousand five hundred pesos (PhP2,500.00) and/or imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Where the violator of this Ordinance does not contest his/her apprehension and elect to pay the fine imposed under the preceding paragraph, the enforcement officer shall forthwith issue citation ticket to the person apprehended without resorting to the court. The citation ticket shall state or contain (a.) the name, signature, age and address of the person apprehended; (b.) the material facts obtaining in the in the commission or omission of the crime defined and defined and penalized under this Ordinance; (c.) the amount of fine which is payable in favor of the Municipal Government of Bulalacao; and (d.) notice requiring the person apprehended for extra-judicial settlement of his/her violation by paying the prescribed amount of fine at the office of the School Principals, CSO Representatives, Barangay Volunteer Sanitary Inspectors, DSWD 4Ps Parent Leader and other volunteers.

SECTION 17. FUNDING. The Local Government Unit shall allocate the amount of one hundred thousand pesos annually (PhP100,000.00) to implement the Enhanced 4S- Strategy chargeable against the account of the Municipal Health Office. The Barangay Government Unit shall allocate funds to augment the implementation of the Municipal-Wide Dengue Prevention and Control Program chargeable against their respective annual budget. In the event, that a dengue outbreak shall have been declare its jurisdiction under a state-of-calamity and may thereof utilize its calamity fund for this purpose.

SECTION 18. FINE FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE SHALL ACCRUE IN FAVOR OF THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. 60% to the Municipal Government
- 2. 30% to fund Dengue Prevention / Programs of the Municipality
- 3. 10% to the deputized enforcers who apprehended the violator of this Ordinance. Said incentive shall be given directly to the apprehending officer before depositing the same to the municipal Treasurer/coffer.









